EVERETT YOUTH COMPLETE JUNIOR POLICE ACADEMY

Everett students recently spent a week learning what it is like to be a police officer.

The Everett Police Departments 6th Annual Junior Police Academy, took place the week of July 14th. For five days, the 40 student recruits learned what being a police officer and police work is like.

The student recruits, all middle school students, were instructed in everything from how to perform CPR, to motor vehicle stops, crime scene & evidence processing, and physical training.

“The academy is a great opportunity for the youth of Everett to learn about policing”, stated Chief Steven Mazzie. “It’s also an opportunity for the department to give back to the community.”

The student recruits final day consisted of completion of a ropes course, at Camp Forty Acres in Wilmington. The day is designed for personal development and team building.
